IT WORKS THE WAY YOU WANT IT TO

Look Make is the programme for the Senior Section. It's all about identifying personal challenges and using them, setting yourself a goal and achieving it. There are eight member areas called 'Stations', each of which is open to all members. Phase 1 is all about being an active citizen for the first time, or from a different angle. Phase 2 is about building on existing skills by taking an activity to a new level, while in Phase 3 you have an aim and activity either by gaining a qualification or reaching the activity by someone else. You can take part in your own or as part of a Senior Section group, working through 8 competencies on hand and sign. So much to do either on your own, it's up to you which phase you choose to do in any particular activity, depending on your experience. On completing Phase 1 and 2 of all 8 Stations you will be awarded the exciting One Chief Guide V Challenge Certificate and you have ready to reward your progress. To arrange your certificate, speak to your Senior Section Guide or adult.

IT4MERS

Work to 4, an exciting new peer education project that is about learning from each other - virtual people sharing knowledge and information with one another. It was created and is run by a group of Senior Section members, who are focused on training the trainees, writing the training materials and planning what happens next.

In Girlguiding UK, a peer is a person who is the same age, or belongs to an activity with the same sector, or who has a similar guiding role to you.

LEADERSHIP

Working in Council is for any member of the Senior Section, but is primarily for 14-18 year olds. It will help you meet and practice leadership skills and when complete you will receive a leadership certificate. Leadership is an essential skill that employers and colleges look for, so working on leading a Council can really make a difference to your future.

At 16 you can begin working on the Leadership Qualification, which means you could be a Leader by the time you are 18.
