Pack your bags

What you take on a walk may depend on who's going, where you are going, when you are going (both time and season), how far you are going and how long you intend to be out for.

These are some suggestions

- Rucksack with shoulder pads and waist strap
- Waterproof liner
- Comfortable clothing, preferably wicking, not cotton (definitely no jeans!)
- Spare fleece or microfiber jacket (not cotton as this does not dry easily)
- Waterproof jacket and trousers
- Warm hat and gloves
- · Sun hat, sunglasses and sunscreen
- Plastic whistle (a metal one will stick to your lips when cold)
- Filled water bottle
- Flask of hot drink
- Snacks / packed lunch
- Tissues and small rubbish bag (leave no trace)
- Hand sanitiser
- Map in a map case & Compass
- Head torch
- Group first aid kit
- Group emergency shelter
- Phone
- Purse/wallet

Give each team a rucksack. Set out all the items together at one end of the hall, making sure there are enough of each item, one per team. Muddle them up. Add in a selection of inappropriate items too. The players take turns to run to the end of the hall and choose an item to put in their team rucksack. At the end they score one point per correct item and minus one for something they don't need.

If setting up a relay race where the girls choose items to pack, include some inappropriate items in the game:

- Umbrella
- Rope
- Flip flops
- Heavy notebook
- Travel pillow
- Ipod
- Perfume/body spray
- · Electronic game

- Cuddly toy
- Calculator
- Deodorant

Make a compass

What you need:

- Plain metal paperclip
- Marker pen or tape
- Strong magnet
- Plastic bottle screwcap
- Blue tack or playdough
- Bowl of water

Instructions:


- 1. Unbend the metal paperclip and mark it at one end with tape or marker pen
- 2. Using the north end of a strong magnet, stroke the paperclip from the unmarked end towards the marked end, 30 times
- 3. Fill the bottle cap with bluetack, playdough or similar and stick your magnetised paperclip flat across it
- 4. Float your bottle cap in a bowl of water and it should point North

Never, Eat, Shredded, Wheat


- 1. Start just with the four cardinal points, North, South, East and West.
- 2. Write them on sheets of paper and attach these to the corners of a room so that each one corresponds to the actual direction.
- 3. Leader calls one out, eg North and girls run to the north.
- 4. Leader calls out another one eg East and girls run to the east.
- 5. Make it harder once girls have got the hang of it by adding in North-east, South-east, Northwest and South-west, or even use 16 cardinal points.






Theme hike

Theme your hike, make up a story or situation to give it purpose, and perhaps something to do at the end

- Pirates Their treasure chest has been stolen but in their haste the thieves have damaged the chest and they have left a trail of jewels. Use bright coloured sweet papers or gems.
 Each group could make a new chest to put their hoard in. Make sure the loot is all collected at the end.
- Bears Search for honey pots and have a teddy bears picnic at the end.
- Farm animals Collect animal tails. Each group could look for a different kind of farm animal.
- Birds Leave a trail using seeds that can be left in place as a gift to nature. Hide in the bushes and see if you can spot birds coming to enjoy your trail.
- Story Puzzles Leave a trail of large puzzle pieces (simply cut up a colourful picture for each group to find). Each group looks for their own puzzle pieces, makes up the puzzle and uses it a basis for a story
