



Frequently asked questions:

Booking & ticketing:

How do I make a booking?

Each county will be allocated a number of tickets based on its membership, giving everyone a fair opportunity to be part of the adventure.

Tickets will go on sale in September 2026 (exact date to be confirmed), so keep an eye out for updates. When the time comes, bookings will be made through your County Champion – your go-to person for questions and securing your place at this unforgettable event!

Can parent helpers attend?

Parent helpers can attend in a leader capacity providing the guiding ratios are met.

Will there be discounted carer tickets?

Carers will be required to pay full price as the ticket cover accommodation and food provisions.

Can a leader ticket share?

Yes, we are happy for you to split the days between leaders using one ticket.

Are dependant children allowed to attend Anglia 27?

We understand that some volunteers may only be able to attend if they bring their dependent children. Dependent children are therefore permitted to attend Anglia 27, but this is subject to approval by your County Champion, as the child's place will count towards your county's allocated tickets.

A fee of £90 will apply for any child over the age of 1 to cover catering costs for the duration of the event. Please note that dependent children will not be able to participate in activity sessions.

Catering:

Will food be provided?

County sub-camps will manage their own kitchens, while Hautbois Activity Centre will be supplying daily ingredient boxes with everything needed for tasty camp meals. Menus can accommodate all dietary needs, with counties able to pre-select options up to eight weeks in advance.

What activities will be available?

Girls will enjoy 4, 90-minute activity sessions on each full day. Subcamps will be split into groups of 16 for activities. The programme offers a balanced mix of adventure, camp skills, wellness, creative crafts, and music & drama. In addition, girls will also be taken off-site during 1 day experience, an unforgettable highlight.

Is parking available?

Parking is available on-site and you will be asked to complete a request for a parking permit for any vehicles that will be staying on-site during the event. We strongly encourage shared transport and counties will be looking to arrange coaches for their members.

Where do we drop off and pick up?

We will be sharing this information in your pre-visit information ahead of the event.

Do I need a license or qualification to attend this event as a leader?

We recommend that at least one adult in each group holds a Going Away With license to ensure the girls are supported. However, we anticipate that there will be enough qualified leaders across the event to support all groups. If no one in your group holds a Going Away With license, please let your county champion know when making your booking.

Is this a uniformed event?

Uniform is not required during this event, but traditionally girls are asked to wear uniform on arrival and departure.

Will photos be taken at the event?

Our marketing and events team will be capturing photos and filming throughout the event. Wherever possible, images/footage will be non-identifiable. If anyone in your booking does not have photo consent, please let your county champion know ahead of the event.

Documentation:

Will there be template risk assessments/consent form available?

We will provide a template risk assessment, consent form, and kit list. These will be sent closer to the event to the person who makes the booking, via your county champion.

Is there first aid on site?

Each sub-camp will have a first aid lead. The first aid room will be located in the main house, which will be signposted on the map you will receive prior to your visit. Hautbois Activity Centre staff will be available to assist with any medical requirements that require additional support.

Kit list

A full kit list will be provided ahead of the event for you to share with your members.

Volunteering opportunities

How do I volunteer and what is required?

Volunteer bookings will be made directly with the events team at Girlguiding Anglia. There are many roles available including the following:

- **Site services** – e.g. Information point
- **Catering** – e.g. Food preparations, serving, restock and freshening facilities
- **Shop assistant** – e.g. Merchandise, tuck shop
- **Site safety team** – e.g. Road crossing, visitor check-in, site patrols
- **Traditional camp** – e.g. support with activities such as fire lighting, knotting, camp skills etc
- **Wellness area** – e.g. friendship bracelets, manicures, henna etc.
- **Artisan crafts** – e.g. clay work, cupcake icing, woodcraft
- **Music & drama** – e.g. drumming, performance
- **Evening entertainment** – e.g. opening & closing ceremony, talent show, campfire

We will invite you to join a presentation in October 2026 to learn more about the event before signing up and confirming your role. You will stay in the indoor Reed Cutters accommodation and full-board catering will be provided throughout.
