Who can volunteer?

Anyone! There's no requirement to have been involved in guiding before, and we've got lots of opportunities for young people and male members too in supporting roles.

Becoming a role model doesn't need a full-time commitment – there are all sorts of flexible ways to get involved.

Whether you want to help behind the scenes, at special events, or get involved every week, there's loads of ways to inspire girls with Girlguiding.

What roles are there?

You choose the volunteer role that matches your skills and time available. You can be a leader, a helper, a treasurer, fundraiser, administrator, trainer, the list goes on and on...



Leaders

As a leader, you'll support the unit, lead a team of volunteers, and plan and deliver a programme of awesome activities. You'll be supported to complete our leader development programme, gaining qualifications along the way.



Supporting roles

These roles are perfect for you if you can't give time every week, want to help casually or are keen to share a specific skill or passion. This can be anything from camping or football through to photography or managing a shop!



Unit helpers

Lots of new volunteers start out as a helper at regular unit meetings. You'll work alongside other volunteers to give girls fun, friendship, challenge and adventure. There's no responsibility for planning in this role but you'll be a much needed extra pair of hands.
