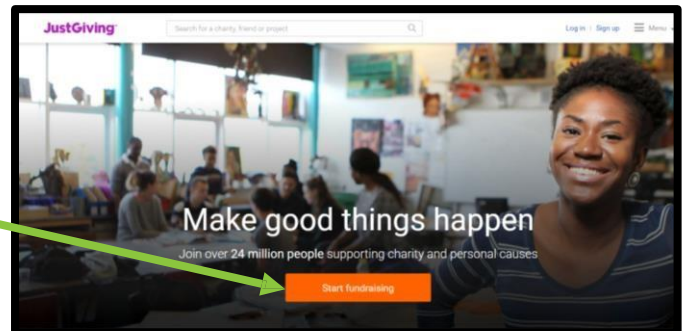


How to fundraise using JustGiving

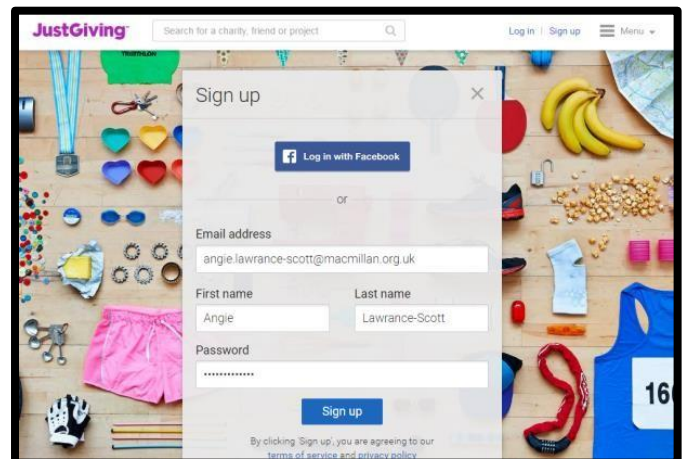
JustGiving is a great tool to use as part of your fundraising for The Macmillan Challenge. Setting up a page is quick and easy and monies raised go directly to Macmillan. Here's some guidance to help you get set up.

Getting Started

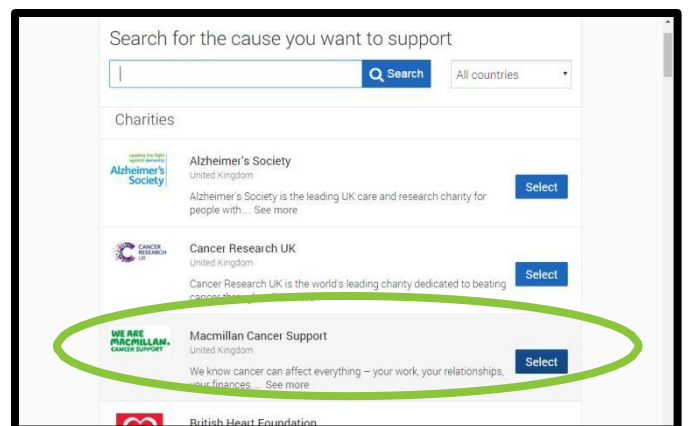
Go to www.justgiving.com and click on the orange button to "Start Fundraising".



You will be asked to set up a JustGiving account.



Make sure you select Macmillan Cancer Support as your chosen charity.




Setting up your event

Under event type select “Personal Challenge”.

You must put “Girlguiding Anglia” somewhere in the Event name so we can link your fundraising to The Macmillan Challenge.

Fill in the information about your event.


